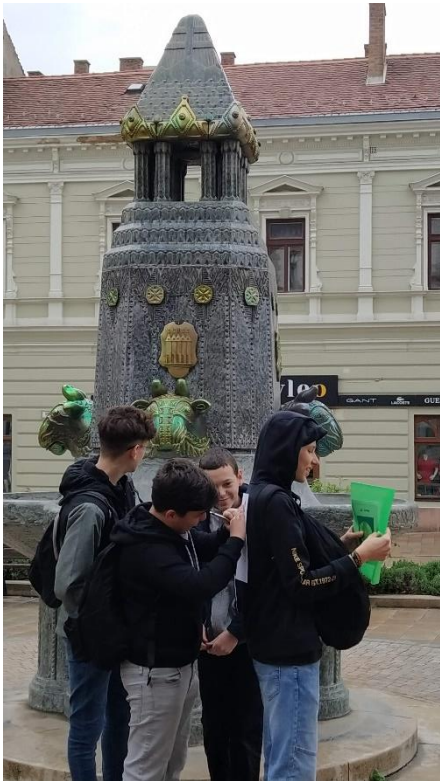


The “Vase Quest” project day
